

## Year 11

What type of homework will be set and how often will it be set?

<b>English</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practice exam questions from the GCSE English Literature Paper or English Language Paper. They will be set a different type of question each week that relates to their recent and past lessons. They will also be set revision activities such as revision cards and mind maps that reflect what they have done in their recent lessons.
<b>Maths</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set a combination of practice exam papers and a self-marking task on Maths Watch based on the work they will have been completing in lessons and their CGP Knowledge Organisers.
<b>Science</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be required to login to Pearson Revise online using their school gmail account. Home learning will be based on learning key information from the online revision guide and online quizzes. Weekly tests will take place based on the revision guide pages and scores will be added to class charts.
<b>History</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set self marking quizzes or exam style practice questions on their Google Classroom. The questions will be linked to the History Knowledge Organisers which are relevant to the topic being studied at the time.
<b>Geography</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set self marking quizzes via a link on their google classroom or exam questions to complete. The questions will be linked to the Geography Knowledge Organisers and work completed in lessons.
<b>French</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be asked to complete Blooket quizzes on a selection of words from their revision guides via a link on their Google Classroom. Then, they will be tested in class by doing a spelling test.  Students will also be asked to complete practice questions from one of the four key skills. For example, a reading exercise from the Activeteach exercise books. This will take approximately 45 minutes.
<b>Computer Science</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be tested on their knowledge and understanding of key technological concepts and skills. This will include practical activities and short to medium answer questions.

<b>Art and Design</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be tested on the information in their knowledge organiser, including keywords, definitions and 'How To' guides related to Art. Students will also be expected to work on their portfolios (GCSE Coursework) at home or after school in open studio sessions, including weekly observational drawing tasks.
<b>Business</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be tested on the information on their Knowledge Organiser, as well as practice of exam questions on the current topic, that is being delivered in lesson.
<b>Dance</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practical choreographic rehearsal tasks that relate to the GCSE set stimulus. They will also be expected to complete questions from the GCSE Dance written paper, including critical appreciation of their own and others' work.
<b>Drama</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practice questions from the GCSE Drama exam paper. There will either be multiple choice drama knowledge questions, or they will be required to write an extended answer for the drama tech question at the beginning of the paper.
<b>Engineering</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practice exam questions from the exam paper. They will be tested on research in preparation for their project. This could make use of Seneca and Google classroom
<b>Food Preparation</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practice exam questions from the exam paper. They will be tested on research in preparation for their project, as well as preparing recipes to cook.
<b>Hair</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set research tasks which will relate to the upcoming lesson to help prepare them. This will include keywords. They will also be set design tasks such as posters and information guides to show their understanding of certain aspects within a topic.
<b>Media</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practice exam questions from the GCSE Media paper. They will be set a different type of question each week that relates to their recent and past lessons. They will also be set revision tasks that help them revise key terms and media theory.
<b>Music</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set rehearsal, composition, listening and revision tasks.
<b>Photography</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be tested on the information in their Knowledge Organiser, including keywords, definitions and 'How To' guides related to Photography. Students will also be expected to work on their portfolios (GCSE Coursework) at home or after school in open studio sessions, including taking weekly photoshoots (min 30 images).

<b>Psychology</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practice exam questions from a GCSE paper. They will be given a different type of question each week that relates to their recent and past lessons. They will also be set revision tasks that help them revise key terms and theories. This will be in the form of class quizzes.
<b>Religious Studies</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	Students will be set practice exam questions from a GCSE paper. They will be given a different type of question each week that relates to their recent and past lessons. They will also be set revision tasks that help them revise key terms and teachings. Quizzes will be set in class rather than online.
<b>Sport</b>	<b>Weekly</b>	GCSE PE - Exam questions based on the topics we have covered in lessons and that are on the knowledge organisers.  VCERT Sports Studies - Google forms/practice questions will be set in the form of practice questions related to the knowledge organisers and topics being covered in class.
